AC® Yellowhead Alfalfa (Medicago falcata)



Alfalfa (*Medicago falcata*) is a long-lived perennial legume that is characterized by widely branched roots, a deep set crown, less upright stems, with fairly narrow leaves and yellow flowers. The yellow flowers produce pods that are sickle shaped unlike flowers of traditional Alfalfa (*Medicago sativa*) that producer multi-curled pods from their mostly purple flowers. *Medicago falcate* is extremely cold tolerant and winter hardy.

Bred in Canada for the harsh Canadian environment AC® Yellowhead is ideally suited to long duration mixed pasture stands where maximum persistence is required.

Highlights:

• Ideally suited for long duration mixed stands where persistence is desirable

- Extremely winter hardy
- 1-2% higher protein than Beaver, Rambler or Heinrichs
- Selected for improved winter hardiness and persistence
- Suited for pastures in both northern and southern areas and for hay where one harvest per year is intended
- Widely branched roots with limited creeping rooted expression
- Maintains itself better in mixed swards with grass compared to Beaver or Rambler
