Alfalfa (Medicago sativa)

Alfalfa (*Medicago sativa*) is characterized by a deep tap root, narrow crown, fairly wide leaves, erect stems and predominately purple flowers. Alfalfa has been referred to as the "Queen of Forages" due to its importance as a forage crop.

Bred in Canada for the harsh Canadian environment, Peace provides superior winter hardiness and improved yield potential in the Peace River Region of Alberta and British Columbia.

Highlights:

• 5% higher forage yield potential than the check variety Beaver in uniform alfalfa variety tests conducted in Beaverlodge, Fort Vermilion and Lacombe

- Selected for superior winter hardiness and quicker recovery after cutting
- Higher crude protein than Beaver or Algonquin
